Dear Councillor,

I read in the agenda for the Wealden District Council Full Council meeting on May 24th 2023 that Kelvin Williams is being promoted for the “crime & disorder” and “land holdings” portfolio.

I consider this to be a totally inappropriate appointment.

Let me explain why. I swore an affidavit relating to Ian Kay's commentary on his father in law's planning application for the Sandcastle, Pevensey Bay. A supporting microfiche then became unavailable. I sent the affidavit to the District Solicitor and it was date stamped as received by WDC on 15.iv.2016. The covering letter ( overleaf ) inviting WDC to sue me was initialled by “KW” . I then contacted WDC asking for a solicitor certified copy of an affidavit which I had sent in many years previously relating to the Old Steamhouse, Herstmonceux. I was told that I could not have a copy, but I could come and collect the original. I came to WDC's offices, collected an envelope from Mr. Tony Earl, and upon returning home found that it contained the whole of the original Kay Commentary affidavit date stamped on every page, plus the covering letter.

The Old Steamhouse affidavit is significant because it was raised immediately after my sighting of the original enforcement report which had been retained at the back of archive copies of an AP(S) agenda. The decision to enforce against the Old Steamhouse was fraudulent because members were not told that it is a historic asset. In addition to being an example of one of the earliest electricity generating complexes, it is virtually unique because via load levelling, it was able to supply current when the generators were off. Any elected member may demand sight of this report and I recommend that you do so. If my affidavit is not on this live enforcement file, Kelvin Williams is amongst those who must be questioned as to why. Keeping this pseudo enforcement running for the last thirty years has been a nice little earner for your planners.
